The project includes interactive online workshops with youth and training for 10 teachers and frontline workers.	\$30,430
2. Conservation Volunteers Australia (Australian Trust for Conservation Volunteers)	Plant. Share. Belong. A place-based project that brings migrant and non-migrant Tasmanians together in shared community planting and picnics. Tree planting symbolises putting down roots in a new community, fostering belonging, social cohesion, and shared responsibility through connection with others.	\$44,985
3. Burnie City Council	Burnie 200: Connecting Cultures, Building Community This project will deliver a coordinated program of cultural humility workshops, community dialogue sessions, and multicultural events to strengthen social cohesion in Burnie. Delivered by the Burnie City Council in partnership with local organisations, including Welcome Cultural Services and culturally diverse communities.	\$22,788
4. Diversity Arts Australia	Tasmanian Anti-Racism and the Arts Training Series An arts-based initiative delivering workshops and community dialogues to address racism, build social cohesion, and equip artists, arts workers, and community organisations with practical anti-racism tools.	\$45,000
5. Kickstart Arts Incorporated	Shared Table, Shared Stories A cultural exchange program connecting school students with refugee and humanitarian entrant communities through shared meals, storytelling, and creative participation at Kickstart Arts. It is delivered in partnership with the social enterprise Sunlight Kitchen project.	\$25,000

Migrant Resource Centre Tasmania	Okay to Talk – support and counselling for people experiencing racism To address the impact of racism, the Phoenix Centre will deliver a practical, supportive anti-racism service for culturally and linguistically diverse Tasmanians affected by racism, including individual counselling, group information sessions, and anti-racism action cards.	\$44,797
