Definitions

What does LGBTIQA+ stand for?

This term is short for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer and questioning, asexual, aromantic and agender.

It is important to recognise that this acronym does not cover all forms of sex, gender, gender identity and sexual orientation and is not intended to be limiting.

The ‘+’ after the acronym is in recognition of this, and points to the fact that there are other terms and language people might want to use to describe these experiences and concepts.

About the LGBTIQA+ Grants Program 2025-26

In 2025, the Tasmanian Government released [Our Inclusive Island: Tasmania's LGBTIQA+ Strategy 2025-26 \(the strategy\)](#).

The strategy reflects the Tasmanian Government's commitment to a Tasmania where LGBTIQA+ people are safe, healthy, visible and valued – living with dignity, belonging and pride.

In 2025-26, the LGBTIQA+ Grants Program (the Grants Program) will provide total funding of \$65,000 to support community organisations, tertiary institutions and Local Government to:

- Build capacity of the LGBTIQA+ community.
- Foster inclusion, respect and dignity for LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians.
- Enhance access to services and increase participation for LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians.

Grants of between \$1,000 and \$30,000 (GST exclusive) are available across two project categories:

Category 1: Priority Projects

Applicants should demonstrate how the project will achieve one or more of the following outcomes for trans, non-binary and gender diverse young people:

- Greater inclusion, acceptance and belonging through community connection activities.
- Increased understanding of the harm caused to individuals and community through prejudice and discrimination.
- Enhanced leadership capacity among trans, non-binary and gender diverse young people.

Category 2: General Community Projects

Applicants should demonstrate how the project will achieve one or more of the following outcomes:

- Increased understanding of issues affecting the LGBTIQA+ community in Tasmania.
- Increased community awareness of the issues and needs of LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians or for prevention of their discrimination, vilification and harassment.
- Increased awareness of LGBTIQA+ issues and needs in Tasmanian workplaces.

- Reduced barriers for LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians in accessing services related to sexuality, gender or intersex status.
- Greater celebration and inclusion of LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians in the wider community, particularly in rural and regional communities.

Please note, you are not required to demonstrate that your project achieves all outcomes.

What can the Grant be used for?

The Grants Program is providing funding to support community organisations, tertiary institutions and Local Government to:

- Build capacity of the LGBTIQA+ community.
- Foster inclusion, respect and dignity for LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians.
- Enhance access to services and increase participation for LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians.

All funded activities must contribute to the achievement of the Grants Program's outcomes and benefit the community, not an individual.

Grant funding can be used for eligible direct costs of your project, including:

- Equipment essential to project delivery.
- Sub-contractors, consultants and/or external service provision.
- Consumables.
- Marketing.
- Materials.
- Salaries and wages for staff directly engaged to deliver the project.
- Venue hire.
- Monitoring, evaluation and reporting costs.
- Contingency (capped at five per cent).

When must the project be delivered?

The project must be completed, and the grant money expended by 30 June 2027.

What can't the Grant be used for?

Funding is not available for:

- Projects that are not related to the LGBTIQA+ community.
- Projects delivered outside of Tasmania.
- Ongoing or recurrent funding for programs.

- Projects that have already commenced or have been completed (retrospective funding is not permitted).
- Projects that are the same as other projects or programs already available in the same locality.
- Creating a fee for service activity during the grant period.
- Core operational costs of an organisation such as routine office equipment, energy, water, rates or insurance.
- Capital expenses, including but not limited to building works (including maintenance) and equipment purchase.
- Payment of existing debts or budget deficits of an organisation.
- Projects involving political activities.
- Projects already receiving funding from the Tasmanian Government.
- Purchase of alcohol, tobacco or smoking related products.
- Donations, gifts, fundraising and/or prizes.
- Personal or private expenses.

Applicants may be asked to supply documentation to support eligibility claims as part of the application process, or as part of an audit process to confirm claims were true and correct.

How much can be applied for?

Eligible applicants can apply for funding of between \$1,000 and \$30,000 (GST exclusive). The total funding pool available under the Grants Program is \$65,000.

Applicants must indicate in the application whether partial funding will be accepted.

Who can apply?

Eligible applicants

The 2025-26 Grants Program is open to applications from:

- A local government authority (council).
- An incorporated community group.
- An incorporated not-for-profit organisation.
- A not-for-profit company registered under company law.
- Tertiary institutions.

Applicants must:

- Have appropriate public liability insurance (a copy of your current public liability insurance cover must be included with the application).
- Hold a currently active Australian Business Number (ABN) or, if eligible, provide a Statement by Supplier Form from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Unincorporated organisations are encouraged to consider the Small Community Grants Program administered by Working It Out.

Can an organisation apply more than once?

If your organisation received funding in the 2024-25 LGBTIQA+ Grants Program and meets the criteria under the 2025-26 Grants Program, you are eligible to apply for funding.

If your organisation has multiple eligible projects, you can submit a separate application for each project and across both categories.

You should not submit the same project under both categories. Please choose the category that is most relevant to your project.

Who can't apply?

Ineligible Applicants

The following entities are not eligible to apply for funding under the Program:

- Australian Government agencies.
- Tasmanian Government agencies.
- Schools or colleges (government or private).
- Political parties.
- Individuals and/or sole traders.
- For profit organisations and businesses.
- Organisations already receiving Tasmanian Government funding for the project.

I'm still not sure I can apply – what should I do?

Taxation and financial impacts

Organisations must indicate whether they are registered for GST in their grant application.

To help with understanding GST, you can visit the Community Grants [website](#).

If you do not have an Australian Business Number (ABN) you may be required to complete a 'Statement by a supplier' form. You can read about who is eligible to use and access the form through the [ATO website](#).

Applicants should contact the ATO on 13 28 66 or www.ato.gov.au for any advice or clarification on GST.

During the assessment process DPAC may require further information to support or clarify an application. The requested information should be provided within 3 business days, otherwise it may result in the application being unsuccessful.

If the Grant Program is oversubscribed, the assessment panel may apply moderation to ensure equitable distribution of funds. In making final recommendations, the panel may consider:

- The overall mix of projects to ensure a balanced range of outcomes, approaches and communities are reached and there is a balance across both categories.
- Previous DPAC grant funding history, to promote broad and fair access to funding.

What happens if the application is successful?

If successful, you will receive a notification of the decision, so please ensure organisational contact details in SmartyGrants are current.

Please note that your organisation name, the title of your project and the amount of funding received will be available on the DPAC website.

What happens if our organisation is offered less than what was requested?

Successful applicants may be offered partial funding. Please consider this when completing the application form and clearly identify how all funding being applied for will be used.

What happens if our organisation already has a grant with DPAC?

You can have more than one grant with DPAC.

However, if you have one or more overdue reports or acquittals, then the organisation must complete these before the invoice for this Grants Program can be approved for payment.

Please note that your organisation will not be eligible for the Grants Program if the project you are applying for already receives Tasmanian Government funding.

How will the information provided by our organisation be used?

Your report can be used, reproduced, modified and adapted by DPAC.

Make sure anything you provide complies with the Copyright Act 1968 (Cwlth) and the Personal Information Protection Act 2004.

Reporting and Evaluation

Organisations receiving funding through the Grants Program must complete a Final Report.

This report must include a full statement of expenditure and activities against the grant funds provided and the approved purpose of the grant.

What if our application is not successful?

Organisations will receive an email advising of the Grant Program's assessment decision, and who to contact if you would like feedback on your application.

How to make an appeal

You can ask for a review if you have reason to believe that:

- The persons making the decision had a direct or indirect financial interest in the outcome of the application; and/or
- The preparation of the application was affected adversely by incorrect advice provided by DPAC; and/or
- The persons making the recommendations discriminated against the applicant on irrelevant grounds, such as cultural, religious or linguistic background, race, gender, marital status, sexual orientation, or disability.

To seek a review, organisations must write to the Manager, Community Grants and Programs by email to grants@dpac.tas.gov.au. A request must be received within 28 days from the date that DPAC provides notification of the decision of the application.

How will my information be kept safe?

Any information provided to DPAC or received from DPAC is managed under the conditions of the following Acts:

- Archives Act 1983 (Tas)
- Personal Information Protection Act 2004
- Right to Information Act 2009

Any worker in the Tasmanian State Service must also follow the rules of the State Service Principles, and the State Service Act 2000.

Who do I contact about this grants program?

The Grants Program is administered by DPAC on behalf of the Crown in the Right of Tasmania.
